The President's Perspective



As I've been helping with the preparations for our Temple Beth El 75 th Diamond Jubilee Celebration, I've been going through pictures from the 40th and 50th Tribute Books and the several photo albums compiled by the Temple historians over the years.

I came across these four pictures of our religious school that I'd like to share and reflect upon. Whether we look back at the 1961 picture of the robust numbers of Jewish children in the religious school, the 1990's picture of Miss Irene with the Hagan kids, the current children with Mr. Tim and Miss Susie combining the teaching of our few children at a single table, or last year's planting of a tree on Tu Bishvat, our purpose has been the same: teach our children about the rich history of our Jewish people, teach Torah and the values for living a Jewish life to help repair our world, to teach the Jewish traditions in our communities and homes so they will have the knowledge and experience to practice Judaism, and to demonstrate how Temple members give of themselves for our Temple Community.

The theme that Jill and I have been building the 75th Tribute Book around is looking back at Temple Beth El through the years in passing traditions l'dor va'dor to keep them alive: "for all generations, forever."

I hope you will join in our 75th celebration to reflect upon and honor our congregation in this important and sacred work. It has been our Temple Beth El, Bakersfield, California tradition to be the place in the hinterlands of the Southern San Joauin Valley to live, experience, and teach our Jewish values, history, and traditions from generation-to-generation l'dor va'dor.

May we continue to step up, join in, and be a link in the chain of Jewish history.

The Rabbi's Reflections

Eight Rabbis in 75 Years

This month will be a very special one for Temple Beth El. On Friday, February 24th, I will be officially installed as the eighth rabbi of the synagogue since 1947, and the evening will be enhanced with lots of wonderful guests, including two of my closest colleagues, Rabbi David Lazar and Rabbi Dr. Jonathan Zasloff. The immediate past two rabbis, Rabbi Steve Peskind and Rabbi Cheryl Rosenstein, plan to join us as well for the weekend, and I'm hoping my congregatational colleague, Rabbi Wynne Waugaman, will also be on hand! Being surrounded by other colleagues warms my heart; I celebrate the gifts of other teachers, my predecessors. Standing on the shoulders of giants.

We began our studies in Pirkei Avot (a collection of aphorisms by the rabbis found within the Mishnah, the first Jewish law code ~200 CE) with a text that speaks of the Shalshelet HaKabbalah, "the chain of receiving (the tradition)" that links our evolving tradition back to Moshe Rabbeinu, Our Teacher Moses, at Sinai: "Moses received Torah from Sinai and sent it to Joshua, and Joshua to the Elders, and the Elders to the Prophets, and the Prophets sent it to Members of the Great Assembly. They said three things: Be deliberate in justice, raise many students, and make a (protective) fence for Torah."

I am just a small player in a mighty tradition, one that has made Temple Beth El an important center for Jewish learning and expression. I am the latest custodian of something much bigger than any of us alone, a legacy of learning and a celebration of Jewish values and tikkun (healing, fixing, perfecting) that has been a blessing for Kern County and the entire San Joaquin Valley. How wonderful that both Rabbis Peskind (who served 1979-1982) and Rosenstein (1993-2019) will be joining us! Each of them, in their own ways, along with Founding Rabbi Sanford E. Rosen (Whose installation was September 7, 1947 and who served until 1952), Abraham Haselkorn, Milton Shulman (1953-9), Arthur J. Kolatch (1959-1972), and Stanley I. Robin (1972-1979) have built our sacred foundation for Jewish life in Bakersfield, each contributing their own talents and gifts to building a vibrant community for all.

I do not take this moment lightly; I know that I have big shoes to fill, that this shalshelet dorot Rabbanim (chain of generations of rabbis) ultimately goes way, way back, to Moshe Rabbeinu himself...or perhaps even further back to Avraham Avinu and Sarah Imeinu. After all, the text known as Pirkei Avot, referenced above, carries the word Avot, or parents. What an extraordinary notion, that we have spiritual parents, thinkers who have sustained our existence spiritually, in some ways more than our actual parents. The rabbis teach that if your parent loses something or your teacher ("rabbi") loses something, you search for the lost object of your teacher first. It adds both gravitas and perspective regarding our teachers. Perhaps this is why I consider teaching the apex of contribution in this world. Just like Maimonides, who

his ladder of Tzedakah taught that the highest level of giving is to teach a person a trade.

This emphasis in our tradition on intergenerational learning hearkens to the Kaddish D'Rabbanan, a special Kaddish recited upon learning Torah. Debbie Friedman put it to music:

> For our teachers and their students and the students of the students We ask for peace and lovingkindness, and let us say, amen.

And for those who study Torah here and everywhere:

May they be blessed with all they need and let us say, amen.

May there be peace and lovingkindness and let us say, amen!

And so here we are, with 75 years of service to the Jewish community of Kern County, celebrating our continued strength as a centerpiece of Jewish life in the San Joaquin Valley, with hopes that in another 75 years, perhaps Reece and Jamison and Hendrix and Lennon among others will mark the sesquicentennial of Temple Beth El with memories of our celebration, on Saturday night, February 25th at the Bakersfield Country Club. Add your tribute to this Shalshelet Kabbalah, this longstanding existence of Torah and proliferation of its priceless values that we pray will continue Midor I'dor, from generation to generation, and serve as "A tree of life to those who grasp it, that all who cling to it will be enriched. Its ways are ways of pleasantness, and all its paths are peace."

See you on the 24th at Shabbat services, on the 25th for the gala! Don't forget to buy your tickets!





Making A Difference

"We started in April of 2009, donating pet food to folks who were receiving food from a local church and soup kitchen in Oildale. Quickly we saw a need far broader in this town than imagined. Bakersfield has a high unemployment rate along with overcrowded animal shelters.

"Many community members don't have enough money to feed their beloved four-legged companions. They often have to make a choice between feeding themselves or their pet.

"To date, over 700,000 pounds of pet food has come through our pantry to be given to those in need. Hardship continues for many in our community and the need seems to grow each year.

"We get calls everyday from desperate pet owners asking for help. Many of our pet food recipients frequent food banks themselves. We are solely dependent on public support of monetary contributions, pet food, and volunteer work.

"Our goal is no family pet goes hungry."
