

Rabbi Jonathan Klein's Reflections

G'milut Chasadim: The Jewish Way

Lyle teaches us what it means to be a Jew.

He deserves our thanks: *Todah Rabbah*, Lyle Gartenlaub, for the *Mitzvah* opportunity you generate monthly and for enabling us to perform this *Mitzvah*, too. You enable all of us to live our Jewish values!

On December 27th, notified by **Jana Reichert** of an event organized, orchestrated, and extraordinarily executed by **Lyle** through <u>Apple Core Project</u> (and who serves on their board and is their Garden Director, among numerous roles), a tremendous nonprofit that feeds struggling families and individuals in Bakersfield, I knew I had to show up and be part of this important event. Apparently, this **monthly food distribution event takes place** <u>every fourth Wednesday in the</u> <u>afternoon;</u> volunteer next month!

I was joined by Jana and Joshua Reichert and by Avital and Talia Anders, and before long, hundreds of people took home food to provide for their families: chicken, garbanzo beans, rice, raisins, walnuts, peaches, potatoes, canned soups, canned fruit, and bags of additional items, all very healthy, all meant to support community members who for various reasons (which certainly should be discussed; the ethnicities of the clients served at this event doesn't have to look this way!) have struggled to make ends meet. I was so impressed, especially by the disproportionate role that Lyle had in this act of g'milut chasadim, the "bestowal of kindness" upon the lives of everyday Bakersfieldians.

Lyle directed the entire operation masterfully, supporting Apple Core Project's founder, Jaclyn Allen in responding to the food insecurity of our city. It is stupendously worthy of commendation. However, in reality, <u>Lyle knows that this is what we do as Jews.</u>

The Torah itself teaches that we must provide food for indigent members of our community. In fact, there is no distinction made between Jewish and non-Jewish poor; everyone is entitled to support:

One sustains poor Gentiles along with poor Jews, and one visits sick Gentiles along with sick Jews, and one buries dead Gentiles along with dead Jews. All this is done on account of the ways of peace, to foster peaceful relations between Jews and Gentiles (Gittin 61a).

As part of the Torah service, when we perform a *hakafah* (circuit) with the Torah in our hands, we are reminded with the words of "Al Shlosha D'varim" to be kind to others:

The world stands upon three things: The Torah, worship, and bestowal of kind acts upon others (Avot 1:2).

Feeding needy people is a *Mitzvah* not in the western sense of "a good deed," but rather the true meaning of *Mitzvah*: A Commandment, a requirement by God that we care for all those around us.

So in the scheme of things, what we did on December 27th was rather unremarkable. It's what Jews do.

The question becomes: How do we make sure that we, following lessons taught by Lyle, enable more of us to do this *Mitzvah* as a matter of religious obligation to care for the poor in our communities? How do we expand the amazing work that **Larry Saslaw** and **Jill Egland** do every year with our annual High Holy Day food drive? How do we make sure more of us engage in acts of *G'milut Chasadim*?

I don't have definitive answers, but as we begin 2024, may we find opportunities for all of our TBE Mishpachah to do more *G'milut Chasadim*. It's unquestionably **The Jewish Way.**

Here, at home in Bakersfield, we celebrated Hanukkah with great gusto! The Latke Brunch and the 8 Krazy Kilometers were fabulous! This is how we keep our light shining bright! I am so proud of us and all the hard work put forth by so many. We had fun and an abundance of joy while sharing the holiday with our community.

As the days are slowly getting longer, we have Tu B'Shevat, "The birthday of the trees" to look forward to. We will celebrate a <u>Tu B'Shevat Seder at 10:30 am on Sunday, January 21</u> at the temple. Be sure to join! It is great fun and delicious!

Rabbi Klein is offering lots of learning opportunities. Join us on zoom as we explore our prayer rituals, Tuesday mornings at 9 AM. On Saturday afternoons at 4:30 pm we have been studying our 5 scrolls. A Hebrew class will start January 22 in the evenings through BC.




