LETTER FROM THE RABBI

Answering the Call of the Shofar

October coincides almost entirely with our season of T'shuvah, translated variously as "Repentance," "Return," and "Penitence," but modern Hebrew translates T'shuvah as "Answer." We normally think of T'shuvah during these Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah (the "Ten days of T'shuvah")/Yamim Nora'im ("Days of Awe")/ High Holy Days as an act of returning to our highest selves; it is a call to go back to the Garden (thank you, Joni Mitchell!) when humans were still in our pristine condition, newlyminted inhabitants of the earth, blemish-free. Humans were deemed "very good" and created B'tzelem E-lohim ("in God's image") in the Creation story. All of us, Judaism teaches, are divinely constituted, infinitely valuable.

Despite our proud beginnings and divine pedigree, God having breathed life into the first human, our lives collide with a fragile, chaotic, and at times injurious world. Damaged people and the cruelty they repeat cause us, amidst our fears of our mortality, to contort, leading us astray. These **Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah** from Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur are designed—says Jewish tradition—to straighten out the kinks and dysfunctions that have developed within us during our interface with the brokenness that surrounds us so that we can be on an honorable pathway for another year, pleading to God that S/He move from the **Throne of Judgment** (for "Ashamnu....Chatanu," we are shamefully capable of transgressions) to the **Throne of Compassion** (God is "E-l Rachum v'Chanun," a Compassionate and Merciful God who is rooting for us, for humanity). Jews pray that our lives are signed and sealed during these **Yamim Nora'im** into a metaphorical Book of Life rather than a Book of Death, and our tradition teaches us that in order to ensure this life-giving future year, we must hear the call of the Shofar to "Wake Up!" as medieval Jewish philosopher Rabbi Moses Ben Maimon (Maimonides) taught us in the 12th Century. The shofar pierces our ears with:

"Arise from your slumber, you who are asleep; wake up from your deep sleep, you who are fast asleep; search your deeds, repent, and remember your Creator. Those of you who forget the truth because of daily trivialities, indulging throughout the year in the useless things that cannot profit you nor save you, look into your souls, amend your ways and deeds. Let everyone give up his evil way and his bad purpose..."

Let us ponder for a moment the other definition of T'shuvah, "Answer." Might the act of return and repentance be in and of itself the Answer to our world's fragility? Might Answering this call to change be the answer? As Jews throughout the world ponder how to be better, how to fulfill our divine purpose (bestowed upon not only Jews but all of humanity as descendants of Adam), will we answer the necessity to recognize the image of God in those around us? How will we honor God's image seen within us and within our fellow travelers of the planet? Do we accept the urgency to create the world that we wish for our children and our children's children?

As a Bakersfield rabbi dedicated to the perpetuation of Jewish values, I pray that this requirement to celebrate life, sustain it, and find solutions to our world's problems can urge not only Jews but all of us to pursue a better world. L'shanah Tovah Tikateivu v'Techateimu, may none of us ignore the necessity to answer the ever-present question about how to address suffering and brokenness, within us and within the world around us, and may we be signed and sealed in a Book of Life for another great year and many more to come.





Our next read for Sisterhood Book Club will be <u>The Postcard by Anne Berest</u>. In 2003, twenty-four-year-old Anne Berest's mother, Lélia, receives a cryptic postcard containing only the names of four relatives, who all died at Auschwitz during the Holocaust. Ten years later, Anne embarks on a mission to discover who sent it and why, and she soon discovers more about her family's history and her Jewish heritage. Aided by her chain-smoking mother, family members, friends, associates, a private detective, a graphologist, and many others, she embarks on a journey to discover the fate of the Rabinovitch family: their flight from Russia following the revolution, their journey to Latvia, Palestine, and Paris. What emerges is a moving saga that shatters long-held certainties about Anne's family, her country, and herself.


